

HARASSMENT POLICY

In providing a safe and secure environment for participation in hockey, providers should ensure to the best of their ability players and officials are not subjected to any form of physical, psychological or sexual abuse as a result of their association with hockey.

ANTI DOPING CODE

Hockey NZ supports the New Zealand Government, Drug Free Sport NZ, the FIH and the IOC in the development of national and international initiatives to deter the misuse of drugs in sport. It recognises the need to take strong and positive action to reduce harm to the individual and to the sport, and to educate and inform those persons and organisations whom this policy applies.

HEAD INJURY POLICY

At all Hockey New Zealand
tournaments, Hockey New
Zealand insists that a player that
has received a head injury with
suspected concussion may only
commence playing again when
a medical certificate clearing the
player of concussion has been
supplied to the Tournament Director,
or Tournament Administrator.

CODE OF CONDUCT POLICY

This policy outlines the standards of discipline and behaviour expected of players, coaches, managers, officials, umpires and player spectators in accordance with the rules of Hockey NZ. The Code of Conduct Policy also outlines the process to hear any allegations of misconduct.

MOUTH GUARD POLICY

It is now mandatory for all players taking part in Hockey NZ Youth Tournaments to wear mouthguards. Hockey NZ strongly recommends the wearing of mouthguards by all players at all tournaments. Managers of all teams are to control the use of mouth guards, not the umpires.

SMOKEFREE POLICY

Hockey is a smokefree sport. We proudly endorse the Smokefree/
Auahi Kore message as part of promoting healthy lifestyles to our members. This tournament is totally smokefree, inside and out.


NHHA FACILITY

Address: We are located at 159 Bush Road, Rosedale. Turfs: Games will be played on Cello 1, TigerTurf 2 and Miller 3.

Parking: We have 336 Car Parks located at the northern end car park 'GATE A' (image below for reference).

THE CLUBHOUSE

Pavilion: The Clubhouse overlooks Cello 1 and TigerTurf 2 turfs, including a lounge, canteen/kitchen, and 8 x Changing rooms (lower level).

The Clubhouse will be operating during the tournament where food and drink will be available. Our operating hours will be from 9am - 7pm (minimum each day).

Bathroom facilities: There are toilets inside The Clubhouse and outside connected to the pavilion building. Each changing room also contains toilets and showers.
